More than 300 local business-minded people attended the 2025 EDB Annual Meeting on Wednesday, February 26th. Held at the Tacoma Convention Center, the Annual Meeting was opened by the new Board Chair, Bett Lucas, Sr VP athe Commercial SeaPort Sound Terminal.

During her remarks, she underscored the upcoming EDB Capital Campaign that will raise the resources needed to support the next five years of economic development work in Tacoma-Pierce County. According to Lucas, "... I am confident that together, we will continue to drive meaningful economic growth and prosperity for our community.

The Excellent 10 was followed by two other coveted awards ... The Golden Shovel and the Mountain Mover Award presented by Don Clark, Jr. President CEO of Sound Credit Union and the EDB Vice Chair. Accepting the award for The Golden Shovel was Ozan Kaya, CEO of Voltage Park whose mission is to make AI machine learning infrastructure accessible to all, from large enterprises and research universities to seed-stage startups and nonprofits. The 2025 Mountain Mover Award, intended for people with the most exemplary records of accomplishments and service was given to Bruce Dammeier, former Pierce County Executive.

No Annual Meeting is complete without an inspiring keynote, and this year's event delivered. Tyler Pigott, Senior Director of Sales at StoryBrand, took the stage to share a powerful message on the impact of clear storytelling in business and economic growth.
